Dear Secretary Ross,

Congratulations on your nomination and confirmation as Secretary of Commerce. Your distinguished business career and experience working with manufacturing companies make you uniquely qualified to lead in the new administration.

The Motor & Equipment Manufacturers Association (MEMA) is the leading international trade association representing motor vehicle parts, components, and systems manufacturers. The member companies of MEMA and its divisions, many of whom have signed this letter, would appreciate the opportunity to meet with you in an effort to maximize the industry's growth potential through the updating of the North American Free Trade Agreement (NAFTA) and future free trade agreements.

We thank you for the comments you made during your confirmation hearing recognizing the high percentage of supplier jobs within the motor vehicle industry. This industry manufactures and remanufactures parts, components, and systems for use in passenger cars and heavy duty vehicles and represents the largest manufacturing sector in the U.S., directly employing more than 871,000 Americans. Furthermore, the industry has seen a 19 percent increase in domestic employment since 2012, representing a growth rate three times that of other major sectors of the economy. Motor vehicle parts suppliers contribute more than 77 percent of the value in today's vehicles and, in 2016, suppliers announced approximately \$6.5 billion in investments in the United States.

According to a recent internal MEMA survey, during the last four years MEMA member companies have invested more in the U.S. than in any other NAFTA country. NAFTA has been a key contributor to this investment and U.S. growth. As such, any changes to NAFTA should not risk disrupting motor vehicle supply chains, radically increasing production costs, or decreasing the availability of capital necessary for product development and asset expansion, which would affect job growth.

MEMA stands ready to actively participate in discussions about NAFTA and to share with you our perspective on such topics including accepting U.S. vehicle safety standards across the region, streamlining customs procedures, and improving border infrastructure. As you recognized in your confirmation hearing, suppliers play a leading role in job creation and investment growth and contribute to the overall national economy. Our
